Didn't want to have two exams in one day; didn't get 100% so did not move it forward. > A lot of people are having difficulties with the Advanced Standing process. No clear guidelines as how to apply for it, requirements, etc. Students are finding it stressful to go through a whole spreadsheet to find out what to do. If this could be done before the start of school, it would be helpful as they can contact

- the necessary people (faculty from undergraduate, etc.).
- Advanced Standing in the registration package, but most students wait until school start because they want to ask more information. There are many colleges and universities to check courses for. A lot of students wait for the class to start, check the course outline, etc. before deciding. Hard to do ahead of time, as you need to register, get your Moodle ID, assess course outlines, etc. Students are also waiting for funding, but the school has to hold on to them to see if the course load changes when advanced standing gets approved. Talk to Benjamin to recreate forms to make it easier. The back of the form will indicate how many course credits are required for each class.)
- Noah's Suggestion: can we create a FAQ document with regards to common questions about applying for Advanced Standing? It would help students understand what is going on, and why it is happening that way
