- Accommodations
 - Over the last weeks there has been problems with accommodations:
 - One student was not given the proper schedule
 - Another student had medical records that required a private room and was unable to receive these accommodations d/t a lack of invigilators and classrooms.
 - The department is currently in the process of hiring a position specifically for accomodations
- Cultural Competency
 - Male professors and TA's have been walking into female only practicals
- NSA Health Care Insurance
 - Administrative issues with health care issues
 - Few students were unable to get medical services covered and current services are inadequate
 - Insurance problems should be brought to student services
- Microbiology Exam
 - Students feeling like they have been set up for failure
 - Students do not feel like they have been provided with answers/ how to improve in the future despite Step A review
 - Problems with SAQ
- IS Director WiFi Issues:
 - Computer room does not have wifi
 - CR 4 Tuesdays are worst
 - MPR BAS215
 - Seminar Rooms
 - Common pattern: mass number issue
 - Residence rooms affected by wifi as well
- Problems with maintenance team:
 - Maintenance workers walking into showers/ bathrooms while in use
- Year 1:
 - Student in Year 1 recording practicals with phone and uploading videos to Facebook
 - Students feeling very uncomfortable
 - Some students have accommodations to record practicals but is a disruption to the class and learning experience and consent is not being obtained
- Year 3:
 - IT exam: Student concern regarding the case analysis not enough space was provided for students to provide answers
 - Primary care: Students registering for A and B groups and not getting the opportunity to switch time slots
 - Nutrition: Ongoing problems; low attendance, assignments and marking rubrics are very vague and students are unable to determine where/why marks were taken off
 - Problems surrounding clinic shift selection; students have signed up for clinic shifts that are conflicting with their schedules and feel like they are not being accommodating
