#### **IMG 1:**

Q: Students that failed NPH306 have concerns about next steps

JT: Students have already received communication from Registrars Office with next steps, and depending on whether the students qualify for remediation, academic advisor may advise on next steps. Students should still attend their practicums this term and fulfill the failed course requirements before the clinic entry despite a potential delayed start.

Remediation usually occurs in the spring term, if successful, they may be eligible to enter in clinic in Sept 2021. Please be aware that failing a remediation classifies as a second failure, potentially eligible for dismissal.

Q: Students who live in BC are inquiring of transfers to Boucher campus for internship is possible.

MZ: It is not a likely possibility at this time due to the current differences in the clinical programs of each campus. There is a fair amount of clinical activity that occur in Yr 1-3 at Boucher, whereas Toronto campus holds bulk of clinic activity during the final internship year. We are amalgamated but the programs and curriculum are not aligned yet. Those who are currently living in BC should continue to plan to be in Toronto for their clinic year 2020/2021.
