Dr. Jonathan Tokiwa: Different administrative personnel will be attending the class to monitor, the course developer and instructor is also a part of the process for quality assurance. Also, modifications will be happening as it relates to the particular instructor.

Dr. Tokiwa: There is a bit of hesitation in granting student access to the Boucher slides as the course designer is overseeing the process and assessments. It is being reviewed to ensure that students are getting the most appropriate material as well as the aim is to not overwhelm students with both the Toronto and Boucher slides.

Ahmed Kandil: The course developer has already taken action in comparing the assessments with the slides, making sure that there is 100% correlation between course material and assessment.

Dr. Jasmine Carino: All of the concerns have been given consideration, and the aim is to ensure that there is clear direction as to what assessments will look like and what are the most relevant concepts to be reviewed. It will take time to strike the right balance, not to make a decision that will be to the detriment of the program but also not to disadvantage a cohort.
